

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-370

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MIDDLEBURG, SNYDER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER FIFTEEN, PART TWO HUNDRED AND TWO (§ 15-202) OF THE MIDDLEBURG BOROUGH CODE TO PROHIBIT ANYONE TRAVELING WEST ON EAST OAK AVENUE AND ATTEMPTING TO ENTER INTO THE INTERSECTION AT NORTH MAIN STREET.

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Middleburg, pursuant to its authority under the Pennsylvania Borough Code, amends Chapter Fifteen, Part Two Hundred and Two (§ 15-202), "Traffic Signals at Certain Locations" to promote the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Borough of Middleburg; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Middleburg has proposed amending Chapter Fifteen, Part Two Hundred and Two (§ 15-202), to restrict entering into the intersection of North Main Street from East Oak Avenue; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the Council of the Borough of Middleburg, Snyder County, Pennsylvania:

Section 1: Chapter 15 Motor Vehicle and Traffic, Part 2 Traffic Regulations, Section 15-202 of the Code of the Borough of Middleburg is amended, as follows:

§ 15-202 Traffic Signal or Signs at Certain Locations.

1. At the following locations, traffic signals or signs as indicated below shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected), and traffic at those locations shall be directed by those signals or signs:

Location	Type of Signal
Intersection of Main Street and Market Streets	Traffic control signal
Intersection of East Oak Avenue westbound with North Main Street	DO NOT ENTER

2. Any driver of a vehicle who disobey the directions of any traffic signal or sign shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

Section 2: Saving Clause. Nothing in this Part shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this part.


Section 3: Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Part is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Part. The Borough of Middleburg hereby declares that it would have passed this Part, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsection, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

Section 4: Date of Effect. This Part and the rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders and matters established and adopted hereby shall take effect and be in full force and effect immediately from and after the date of its final passage and adoption in accordance with laws and regulations.


Section 5: Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent that they are in conflict herewith.




